Comparing prices

Today we worked on

We compared prices by finding the cost of one item.

Start here

Read the notebook example below. Divide each total price by the number of items.

An explanation or example

Six notebooks cost \$9. Divide \$9 by 6 to get \$1.50 per notebook. Four notebooks cost \$7. Divide \$7 by 4 to get \$1.75 per notebook. The six-pack has the lower price per notebook, even though the pack costs more.

Do this first

Compare 3 folders for \$6 with 5 folders for \$9. Then compare 4 pens for \$3 with 6 pens for \$6. Show the cost of one item for each offer. You can work on paper.

This can wait

Teacher note: this is a made-up example. The folder prices are \$2 and \$1.80 each. The pen prices are \$0.75 and \$1 each. Assume the items are otherwise equivalent.
